### REFLECTIONS FROM PASTOR JOHN



Currently, we are in the midst of a series entitled, WORSHIP. We chose to use the word, worship, as an acrostic for our theme of worship to look more closely at Wonder, Order, Reconciliation, Stewardship, Healing, Intercession (prayer), and Passion for God's will to be done in our lives and the lives of others. Our God is worthy of our praise and adoration. Wisdom prevails when we give our all unto Him. William Temple understood that. A former Archbishop of Canterbury, he was a wise man willing to share his wisdom because of his own passion for souls. Listen to one of his gems of timeless truth as he attempts to help us understand worship of our Lord and Savior:

**“To worship is to quicken the conscience by the holiness of God,**

**to feed the mind with the truth of God,**

**to purge the imagination by the beauty of God,**

**to open the heart to the love of God,**

**to devote the will to the purpose of God.”**

Therein lies the key to experiencing first-hand the fullness of life as God intends for us, as individuals and corporately, as the living Body of Christ.

When some of my seminary colleagues encountered a passionate atheist in attendance at a Madalyn Murray O'Hair (she of no prayer in school infamy) seminar, he demanded they show him anatomically where his soul was located. I believe William Temple would have prayed for the man's soul and conscience to be quickened by the Holy Spirit. Jesus promised us that He would not leave us as orphans, but would send Another – just like Himself – Who would guide us into all truth. God longs to quicken each one of us with His Spirit, and I say that because of what we find in His inspired Word of Truth.

Romans 12: 2 exhorts us to *not* be conformed to this world, but to be *transformed by the renewing of our minds, so that we may discern what is the will of God ...* Yes, we can feed our minds with truth. And there is a difference between cramming our minds with information and feeding our minds with truth – the truth of God.

Nobody knows better than God how desperately our imaginations need to be purged by the beauty of God. What a precious gift God has given us with this thing we call imagination. How sad and tragic life becomes when we allow our imaginations to foster the myriad ways of corrupting, profaning, and polluting our interior landscapes, which in turn unduly influences our exterior surroundings. God's beauty is to be encountered in so many different ways and He longs to inspire our imaginations with genuine beauty.

Jackie DeShannon sang, “What the world needs now is love, sweet love,” but long before her Jesus was challenging His friends and disciples there at the Last Supper. We find Him saying in John 13: 34-35, “... love one another just as I have loved you ... By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.” Yes, we truly worship God when we open our hearts to the love of God.

Jesus taught us to pray, “... Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven...” To devote our wills – our decision-making and choices to the purpose of God is to truly worship Him; to give our ALL unto Him and invite Him to have His way in our lives ushers in a fresh sense of wonder, invites us to order our days with the ways of God, to forgive one another and be reconciled with Him and one another, to become great stewards of our time, talents, and treasure, to be receptive to all the ways God desires us to be healed and made whole, to pray for one another and to cultivate a passion for the well-being of souls. Let us truly worship our most Worthy God in spirit and truth, and may the world become a better place as a result!

## Safety & Security @ PFUMC



Church...A place where we should all feel safe, right? Once we pass through those doors we should be able to kick back, leave the outside world at the door and worship our Lord and Savior with all our heart, right? Right?

Anyone who reads a newspaper (oops, showing my age...) I mean anyone who checks out the online news feeds knows Christians aren't always safe, even within their own church buildings. We sometimes think it's a sign of the times, but Christians have *always* had cause to worry. Ever since Paul skedad-dled out of Iconium, Christians have had to be proactive about their safety.

So in 2016 a group was formed to take a look at safety and security here at PFUMC. I'd like to thank all those who contributed...it's difficult to stay motivated when your hope is, none of the work you're doing will ever be needed. So thank you to Bob Ankrapp, Bob Goud, Kevin Henderson and Sheryl Picard. I'd also like to thank Brian Good and Pastors Berlanga and Grenfell who weren't officially members of the committee, but who were invaluable as always.

So like any good committee we met... several times... over a number of months... and produced...A REPORT!

Now I may find the report fascinating (to see for yourself, just say the word and I'll send you a copy!), but I realize I may be in the minority. Bob Goud suggested we use our pre-service announcements as a way to disseminate the information, so be sure to check out the new Security Quiz questions before Sunday services.

For now I'd just like to point out a few of the group's recommendations.

Have you noticed that each of the exterior doors are now numbered? This helps when communicating with emergency responders. We might all know where the door by the choir room is, but that doesn't mean much to most of the township police officers. The main entrance is door #1 and they are numbered clockwise around the building. So now you can become familiar with the door numbers, just in case you're the one calling 911 (the door by the choir room is door #4 by the way).

We all know to evacuate the building when the fire alarm sounds. But what do you do if it's 10 degrees outside and your car isn't here? What do you do if you came to church with other people, but after the church was evacuated you can't find them? PFUMC and Praise Baptist Church have both agreed to be Emergency and Reunification locations for each other when necessary. So if your child was in Sunday school and you're trying to find them after the building was evacuated, head across North Territorial (carefully) to Praise Baptist. It has the added benefit of reducing the chaos the emergency responders have to deal with.

Finally, the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training that we had intended to offer has been temporarily put on hold. Plymouth Township is also looking into training, so we hope to coordinate our efforts with them.

So as we try to find that sweet spot in between hyper-vigilant and naively care free...just remember to remain aware of your surroundings and if something just doesn't seem right, bring it to the attention of an usher or a member of the PFUMC staff.

# THOUGHTS FROM PASTOR NICK

## Isaiah 43:19

On Sunday Mornings one of my favorite parts of the service is the Children's Message. It's so exciting to see all the kids gather together to see what the person doing the message has to say. The smiles, the squirming with energy, the honest heart-felt answers to questions; it all helps us remember what love really looks like.

All of you get to see what happens during the service, but I get a special treat. I get to spend time with the kid's before the service. It might be high-fiving some of them, or getting an update on what they did for the week. There's one special buddy, Nolan, that stands out in my mind. Every Sunday we trade our weekly Pokemon Go exploits. My time with him helps get me in the mindframe to worship.

The special regard our church has for children was one of the reasons Lisa and I started attending PFUMC over 15 years ago. We wanted to raise our children in a church where they would learn about God, make friends, and build a strong spiritual foundation.

Those ideas are part of the basis for a change we're making this summer in our children's ministry. Traditionally pre-service Sunday School is very light in the summer. Most families just come to the regular service then. So we had teachers, but no students. So we felt this year we'd mix things up. We're going to be having Children's Church during the time of our regular church service.



This summer parents will have the option of letting their children attend Children's Church for the entire length of worship. Each Sunday the theme of Children's Church will be to focus on a different aspect of the Sunday Worship service. One week the teachers will focus on communion, another week it'll be taking the offering, another week it'll be why we pray. I think you get the idea. In the fall we'll return to our normal service structure with a traditional Children's Message. As always, parents are always welcome to have their children in service.

The idea behind this summer's Children Church is to demystify the worship service for children, and make it something relatable. Then in fall when they return to the regular service, they have a frame of reference, so worship will mean more to them. Hopefully they will feel a sense of ownership in the service.

I have to give the Christian Education committee credit for this idea. I love that they are looking at what we can do better, and then coming up with a plan to address it. Studies show that youth and young adults are leaving the church because they don't understand it, or don't feel they have any ownership in it. Children's Church is a way to try to change those feelings early.

As we move forward through the year, you'll see other changes in different areas. The staff and the different committees at PFUMC are always interested in learning what you think we can do better. Come see us and let's talk. After all, that's how we can unite to build the Kingdom of God together.

### News from Our Corner

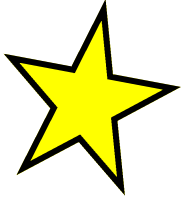
